MINUTES

The Central Noble Community School Corporation Board of Education met in regular session on Tuesday, April 16th at Central Noble Junior-Senior High.

Eric Custer called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The meeting continued with the following Administrator Comments:

- Mr. Gaff noted the Corporation received a \$41,000 Digital Learning Grant for PBL. He also noted that plans for Summer School are underway and that the Summer Feeding Program will also be held again. A climate audit will be held on May 1 & 2, with board training on April 30th.
- Mrs. Vice noted that SAPS is still functioning wells and that DI will be traveling to Globals in MO in late May and that Prom is May 4 on campus.
- Mrs. Hoover noted that iStep is underway, then they transition into iLearn and AP Testing. The annual Tin Caps reading incentive trip is April 23rd
- Officer Worman noted that both new buses, with seatbelts, were received but have been sent back to the manufacturer for some cosmetic repairs. He also noted the academic

improvements from students at SAPS. They are turning in homework and are no longer behind, which is improving their daily attitudes since they are no longer failing

- Mrs. Wilkins noted that the SBOA Audit is fully complete and responses are sent in. Unpaid textbooks and lunch accounts are being sent to collections this week
- Mr. Knipper noted that iRead results are in and is excited to announce the results once they can be made public. For summer school, they have several ideas in mind for enrichment programs for students
- Mr. Morgan noted that Nurse Eash received the Judge Kramer award for her work with students. Kindergarten Round-Up is next week. He also supplied the board with a document with information regarding Therapy Dogs in the school. He requested their approval to continuing research to present for approval to proceed at a later date, which was granted
- Nurse Carmien noted the successes of the Ronald McDonald Care Mobile and Mobile Dentist. The next dates are May 7 and June 12 and they are working on even more dates for the new school year to help kids
